



School Uniform and equipment for September

A reminder that from September 2025 we will be moving towards maroon polo shirts for all children across the school. This change will come into affect from September, with a transition period of a term. We have had many positive comments from parents about this change as the maroon does look smarter and is easier to keep clean.

The maroon polo shirts can be purchased from a range of sources, including Touchline, Warrington Schoolware Centre, and online stores, for example Active Wear Group and Amazon. We have been advised that Next is now also selling the maroon colour.

Please note that it is not compulsory to have the embroided badge.

Additionally, when buying school bags for children, these should be a school book bag or a small rucksack. Your child does not require a pencil case or any other equipment, as this is all

provided by school. Water bottles should be standard size and not the over-sized 'Stanley' style. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Healthy Snacks
